## **TOPICS FOR CONSIDERATION**

A longer list of questions can be found on the diocesan website. They look at three key words in the material from Rome: "Communion", "Participation", "Mission".

### General:

What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow as a synodal church?

What are your dreams and hopes for the synodal process? How would you like to see the Church develop its mission in the coming years?

#### **Communion**:

- 1. What are the ways in which your parish most successfully brings people together?
- 2. How do you relate to members of the Church who have drifted away from practice? (Why have they drifted away from practice? Listen to them.)

#### **Participation:**

- 3. Reflecting on 16 months of the pandemic, how has participation in our parish been affected? Were these issues there before?
- 4. How can we better enable full participation and co-responsibility in the life of the Church at the parish and diocesan levels?
- 5. Which groups and individuals are least included in your parish?
- 6. How can we broaden the way we include people whilst keeping always true to the Gospel and our core Christian identity?

#### Mission:

7. How does the life of the parish, in terms of catechesis, adult formation, liturgy, etc. help parishioners to become missionary disciples?
