Love is at the heart of who God is and who we are called to be.

This parish is served by the Spiritans

The focus of the readings this Sunday is God's love for all peoples and the invitation to share in his divine life. God's love goes beyond national boundaries or racial or ethnic distinctions. God is above historical reality, for he is eternal. He breaks through the barrier of time and enters into history through the covenant so that he might be known. God's love for all nations and peoples is communicated first through Israel and ultimately through his Son.

What does this mean for me? What are my expectations? What are my hopes? What are the expectations and hopes of the people with whom I am associated by blood, by ethnicity, by race or by citizenship?

Jesus challenges us all to reformulate those basic questions from his Father's perspective, which may not always be ours. What are God's expectations for me? What are God's hopes for me? What are God's expectations and hopes for all peoples?

God's love is strong and powerful, it never goes away. He constantly loves and calls us to love. He is love and that love is life and Jesus personifies this love in human fashion. He shows us how to live in divine love and he teaches us that all peoples have a share in that life of love; each one of us is part of His plan.

Catholic Social Teaching is based on this belief that God has a plan for creation, a plan to build his kingdom of peace, love and justice. It holds that God has a special place in this story for each of us, whoever we are.

In the story of our parish, we each belong, we each have our place, and to that end, we are encouraged to join a parish group in which we can build friendships, and from where we can reach out to share God's plan, the Church's mission.

One group to bring attention to this week is The Knights of St. Columba, named after the missionary Saint who brought the Christian Faith to Scotland and Northern England. Founded to support the mission of the Church and to work for the spiritual, intellectual and material welfare of its members and their families, in particular, to help young people develop in the likeness of Christ through the Fundamental Virtues of Charity, Unity and Fraternity.
