Hence, God invites us without any restrictions, but we must be on the mounta to partake of His blessings and favours. In our second reading today, Paul reminds us that if we respond fully to Go invitation, He will continuously strengthen us with his blessings. However, it important to note that God will not fulfil dubious or selfish needs. Instead refers to genuine needs according to the will of God. In today's Gospel, the parable of the wedding feast, Jesus teaches us that, I the first invitees, we may have rejected God's invitation due to the pursuit worldly satisfaction and pleasure- we are simply too busy to respond, there is time for prayer, yet we seem to have time for the mundane. The consequence of rejecting God's invitation are great but the good news for us is that wh God's chosen people rejected His special invitation, He changed the Invitation Card to: "Everyone (nation) is cordially invited!" So why was someone thrown out? The man refused to wear the garment provided for the banquet, which was an insult to the king. Just as the king provided wedding garments for his guests, God provided faith and salvation humanity, and He has made these freely available to us, through Christ Jesus. Accepting Jesus as our Lord and Saviour, means we not only accept to invitation to the wedding but we also wear the garment He has provided us.
