#### SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Mass Book Year B Vol 1 page 85

On this second week of Advent, we continue our waiting and preparation for the Lord's coming. Today in a special way the Church calls us to reflect on the good news that this season brings – that Christ is coming. In light of this, we are also to reflect on what we ought to be doing while we wait for him.

Why is Christ coming? The answer is simple: He is coming because he loves us, he is coming in order to forgive, console, and to save us, and he is coming to make all things (including us) new. He has a mission and that mission is all about us and our world. Last week, the prophet Isaiah lamented and wished that the Lord would tear down the heavens and come down, but today his tone is more optimistic, like someone who is beginning to see the response to his previous plea. It is a sign that we are going to make it, however, it is not yet over, as the fulfillment of this hope still lies in the future, though not too far away from us. In the second reading. In the second reading, Peter assures us that Christ will certainly come. He encourages us not to lose hope in the prophetic promises about the coming of Christ. What we conceive as a long period of time is nothing in God's time, as there is a difference between God's time and ours.

In the Gospel this Sunday, John the Baptist, like Isaiah, brings us the good news about the Lord's imminent coming. He makes an explicit call to us to repent for the forgiveness of our sins. What is there to repent from? Those moments we have denied God through our words and actions, those moments we have failed ourselves and our neighbours, failed to live saintly and holy lives, neglected the good we ought to do, and those times we have not been true to our selves. This season is a time to say, God we are sorry, forgive us. Then the salvation that Jesus brings will be ours, and we will be part of the new generation that he comes to transform and redeem by his love.

Anticipation of the coming of the Lord should motivate us to respond with repentance, and of course, in joyful expectation of our salvation.

Humbly we pray "Let us see, O Lord your mercy, and give us your saving help".


