Given enough interest, we hope to again arrange a day's "mini-pilgrimage" to travel and spend a day experiencing the historical and peaceful surroundings of Minster Abbey, its gardens and neighbouring church.

Minster Abbey (circa 670 AD), possibly the oldest inhabited house in the country, is not far from the coast where St Augustine landed in 597, followed by Vikings in the 9^{th} to 11^{th} centuries. It is now home to a community of Benedictine nuns and houses relics of St Mildred, the second Abbess.

Proposed Itinerary and provisional cost, based upon past visits.

- Coach transport from Hartley leaving at about 9.00 am for about an hour's drive.
- Coffee or tea at the tearoom in the neighbouring garden, run by young people in the Looking Ahead Project.

- Visit shop to buy religious objects and souvenirs or tearoom for additional refreshments and produce.
- Midday prayer with the sisters.
- Simple lunch fresh bread and soup with beverage.
- Hear a short talk by one of the sisters about spirituality in everyday life.
- Time to reflect and discuss.
- Afternoon tea or coffee and home-made cake.
- Depart 3.45pm (approx.) to return in time for 5.30pm Mass in Hartley.
